

Writing to the early church at Corinth, the apostle Paul said "I appeal to you brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in

the same mind and the same judgment. (1 Corinthians 1:10). The fact is that division and multiplication have been part of the church universal since Jesus left the earth on Ascension Sunday more than two thousand years ago. Though today the people called Methodists will hear and respond to Paul's plea much differently than those who lived in ancient Corinth, division is something the church will likely continue to struggle with until such time as our Lord returns and makes things right. Then and now, people are divided, albeit over different things. What has not changed is that people are concerned more with the things of this world than they are with the things of the world to come.

The good news is that there was no such division at the Allegheny West Provisional Annual Conference held May 22-25. Just under one thousand people, clergy and laity alike, gathered for worship, prayer, learning and celebrating the new things that God is doing in His church. The theme was "Building Together", and our focus was on letting go of the past and beginning the process of rebuilding that which had fallen into great disrepair. We found great encouragement and inspiration from the prophet Nehemiah as we heard once again how he overcome great opposition and led a powerful team that rebuilt the city of Jerusalem and the holy temple of God. Yes, with God, all things are possible, even unity in sound mind and judgment.

In his second letter to the Corinthians, Paul reminds them and us that the problem of division is related to the truth of the Gospel. But as believers, "we do not lose heart! We have renounced disgraceful, underhanded ways and refuse to tamper with the truth". (2 Corinthians 4:2) It is not that the Gospel is powerless to help people overcome sin, but that sin prevents people from hearing and being transformed by the Gospel. Unbelieving minds are blinded by the god of this world-in other words Satan. The problem is not with the message, but with those delivering or receiving it. The mission of the church, our mission, is to make the light of the Good News known to a world that loves darkness. The God that created everything, including the light that dispels the darkness, has called us to open our hearts to those who have not heard the Gospel-the Good News. He has also given us the ability to open our minds and come up with effective ways to share that Good News of God's glory-Jesus Christ-with the lost, those whose hearts and minds are still closed by Satan. May we never forget that it is not advertising slogans or church structure that will change hearts and minds, but the message of the Gospel delivered through the Holy Spirit. Let the rebuilding begin! Pastor Greg
