Is prayer a verb or a noun? The answer is yes! A prayer is someone who prays or communicates with God and a prayer is also the words and thoughts we choose to use to communicate with Him. Does God hear our prayers? The answer is maybe. We know from Proverbs 15:29 that "the Lord hears the prayer of the righteous". James 5:16 says "the effective prayer of a righteous person has great power". Does that mean we have to say the right words or think the right thoughts for God to hear our prayers? The Bible does teach that what is in our heart matters more to God than the words or thoughts that come from our mind. However, those things are always connected. Sometimes when we pray, it is easier to recite our typical "grocery list" of needs and concerns than it is remember how He has already provided for us. We can be so focused on the here and now that we fail to stop and consider the past and the future. Yes, some things are best left in the past. Wounds that are healing are best left to heal undisturbed. However, many times the answers to our prayers will come when we ponder what God has already done and will do for us in the future, rather than on the immediate concern of the hour.

One of the common themes of the Psalms is that God speaks to those who turn to him in their hearts. If we desire to pray in such a way that God will hear us, and we will hear His response, we can learn much from Psalm 85. On behalf of the people of Israel he earnestly prayed to God for answers to 3 pointed questions. Will you be angry with us forever? Will you prolong your anger through all generations? Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you? Answers to such questions will come from a powerful prayer from a righteous prayer. The prayers of the righteous are all about God, remembering what He has done for us in the past, what He is doing for us right now, and what He has promised to do for us in the future.

God's faithfulness in the past brings us hope for today. The hymnwriter said it this way: "morning by morning new mercies I see". We also hear the answer to our prayer of today when we remember what God has promised to do for us tomorrow. In times of doubt, God's people can stand on the Old Testament and New Testament promises that our future is secure. Psalm 85:9 tells us that "salvation is near to those who fear Him and His glory will dwell in our land". That was fulfilled in the past in the earthly ministry of Jesus Christ and someday will be completely fulfilled in heaven. As we move from Lent to Easter, be a prayer and say a prayer that God hears! 
